

Daugavpils Church Hill is a unique object of sacral tourism



in Daugavpils with the churches of four different confessions standing there side by side: Martin Luther Cathedral, Roman Catholic Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, The Saints Boris and Gleb Russian

Orthodox Cathedral and the Church of the First Old-Believers' Community.

Daugavpils Museum of Local History and Art is one of the



oldest museums in Latgale. The museum is located in a magnificent eclectic building with the elements of Jugendstil, constructed in 1883. Each entrance is guarded by two sculptures of lions. The museum offers cultural, historical and

nature exhibitions as well as the possibility to take part in various educational programs. <u>www.dnmm.lv</u>

Daugavpils Clay Art Centre offers visitors the opportunity



to get acquainted with the cultural heritage of Latgale - ceramics and pottery traditions. The Clay Art Centre is the only place in Latvia where visitors can see and learn about the hardened **Baltic Raku ceramics** which is being matured in fer-

mented rye flour liquid. Children and adults are offered an opportunity to take an exciting master class and create their own masterpieces. www.dmmc.lv

There are artificially created jungles in Latgale Zoo where



visitors can see spotted pythons, spectacled caimans bathing in the sun, red koi carps swimming in the pond, playful macaques and sugar gliders jumping in the lianas and other swimming,

whistling, crawling, hopping and flying tropical creatures. A visit to Latgale Zoo is a lot of fun for children and adults. http://latgaleszoo.biology.lv/

Daugavpils (Dvinsk at that time) was one of the leading Jewish



cities of the Russian Empire and a centre of Jewish culture. The exposition of museum **Jews of Daugavpils and Latgale** tells about the life and household traditions of Jews in Latgale and Daugavpils since 1935. In the same building there is

a **Synagogue** that is the only in Eastern Latvia that is open for tourists.

Daugavpils Lead Shot Factory is the oldest ammunition



factory in Northern Europe, founded in 1886. It is the only factory of this type in Baltics and one of the oldest objects of industrial heritage in Latvia. The shot tower of the factory is the only one in Eu-

rope that is still in operation. www.dsr.lv

Rīgas Street is the first Pedestrian Street in Latvia where you



can see a unique sculpture dedicated to Latgalian ceramics. Daugavpils is one of the few Latvian cities that can boast of a unique ensemble of classical and eclec-

tic buildings. This part of Daugavpils attracts both locals and guests with its small street cafes, cozy restaurants, boutiques and unique atmosphere.

Daugavpils Central Park is a popular recreation park with



the only in Latvia exclusive benches alley and the Tree of Love. Children of different ages can spend their time on the spacious playground; adults can exercise using outdoor fitness equipment.

Daugavpils Theatre. The Daugavpils Theatre is one of the



oldest professional theatres in Latvia.

Daugavpils theatre history started in the 50ths of the XIX century, when the Russian Drama Theatre, the first Russian Theatre, was founded in Dinaburg

(nowadays - Daugavpils) in 1856. The theatre was founded and maintained by Daugavpils Fortress chief engineer Nikolay Hagelstrom who was a sincere theatre admirer. The theatre has got an extensive repertoire in Latvian, Russian and Latgalian languages. Nowadays the theatre team receives awards for creative and courageous performances. http://www.daugavpilsteatris.lv/

Multifunctional Sport Complex. Visitors can enjoy 25-me-



tre swimming-pool with 6 tracks, which can be used for physical health improvement as well as for relaxation. A small swimming-pool is meant for children and for agua aerobics. It is

possible to combine the visit to the swimming-pool with a Turkish bath and/or a sauna. There is a modern fitness and aerobics hall. There is also a fencing hall which is the only one in Baltics. http://www.daugavpilsoc.lv/

Daugavpils Ice Hall is a modern sport, recreation and cul-



tural centre with about 2000 places for visitors. Hockey and figure-skating trainings for sportsmen and visitors as well as international competitions take place there. Everyone has the op-

portunity to take a rented skates and have a good time.

Speedway Centre - "Locomotive" Stadium It is one of the



biggest speedway stadiums in Europe, where International competitions and Speedway Grand Prix of Latvia take place.

Dubrovin Park. Pavel Dubrovin (1839-1890), who was the



city Mayor in 1876-1890, took an active part in laying out this park. Because of this fact the park was named after P.Dubrovin and his monument was placed there. Anyone can find refresh-

ment near a big park fountain on a hot summer day, but in the evenings people can enjoy a play of light and water there.
